



2022 Newsletter

2022 began with the Master's Quarter Peal Tour taking place on the Wirral from 14-16 January. Seven of the nine attempts were successful, with methods rung including Bristol, Yorkshire and Lincolnshire, and a first on 8 for Grace Dooley, covering to Plain Bob Triples.

The Dinner Tour was held from 4-6 February in Bransford, near Worcester, with a walking tour of the City arranged by the Social Secretaries. There was much enthusiasm for the return of the Dinner Tour; this was demonstrated on both Friday and Saturday evenings through the consumption much alcohol. The Guest Speaker was Suzie Mansfield, selected by the Master as Suzie was not only a ringer, but also the Landlady of a fantastic pub in Durham (the Station House). The meal was followed by a Barn Dance by the Cats Whiskers. Quarter Peals were rung on both the Friday and Sunday of the tour.
